ORDER

On August 31, 2026, after hearing the evidence and argument of counsel and Applicant, the Court finds that Verna Caddie, Applicant, has failed to show by a preponderance of the evidence that on more than one occasion and pursuant to the same scheme or course of conduct that is directed at Verna Caddie, Respondent Candice Matthews knowingly engaged in conduct that:

(1) constitutes an offense under Section 42.07, or that Candice Matthews knew or reasonably should have known Verna Caddie would regard as threatening:

(A) bodily injury or death for Verna Caddie; or

(B) that an offense will be committed against:

(i) a member of Verna Caddie's family or household;

(ii) an individual with whom Verna Caddie has a dating relationship; or

(iii) Verna Caddie's property;

(2) causes Verna Caddie, a member of Verna Caddie's family or household, or an individual with whom Verna Caddie has a dating relationship:

(A) to be placed in fear of bodily injury or death or in fear that an offense will be committed against Verna Caddie, a member of Verna Caddie's family or household, or an individual with whom Verna Caddie has a dating relationship, or Verna Caddie's property; or

(B) to feel harassed, terrified, intimidated, annoyed, alarmed, abused, tormented, embarrassed, or offended; and

(3) would cause a reasonable person under circumstances similar to the circumstances of Verna Caddie to:

(A) fear bodily injury or death for the person;

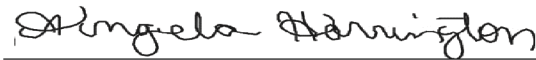
(B) fear that an offense will be committed against a member of the person's family or household or an individual with whom the person has a dating relationship;

(C) fear that an offense will be committed against the person's property; or

(D) feel harassed, terrified, intimidated, annoyed, alarmed, abused, tormented, embarrassed, or offended.

Therefore, the Court denies Applicant's application for a protective order.
